What is the Transit Option?

- The Transit Option provides four distinct designated tie-down securement locations on the frame of the wheelchair. Transit Option seating may also include tested mounting hardware used to secure the seating system to the frame of the wheelchair.
- Crash-tested for use with Wheelchair Tiedown and Restraint Systems (WTORS) that comply with SAE J2249. When used in conjunction with proper tie-down and occupant restraints, in appropriate vehicle solutions, the Transit Option offers a complete and approved transportation method.
- Factory installation and Retrofit Kits are available.

What is SAE J2249?

- SAE (Society of Automotive Engineers) created the standards for the WTORS systems and requires that these systems withstand 30 mph crash tests.
